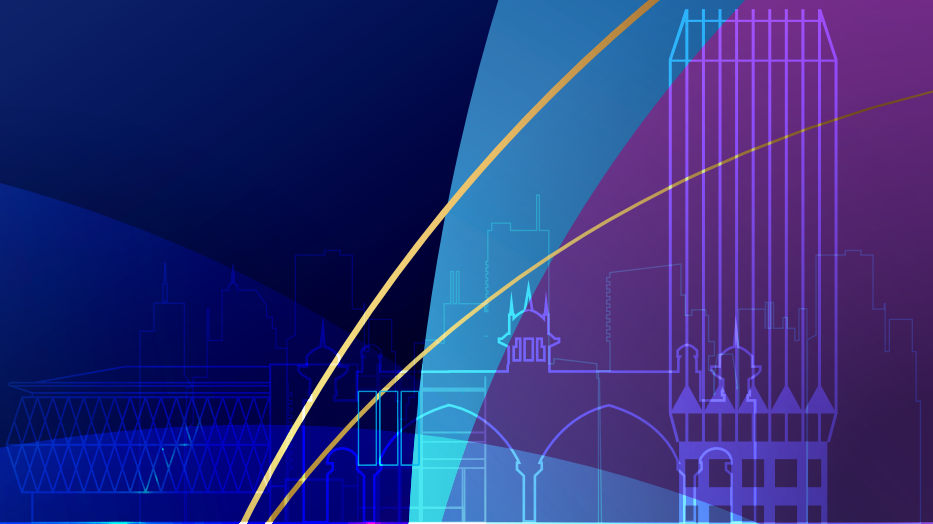

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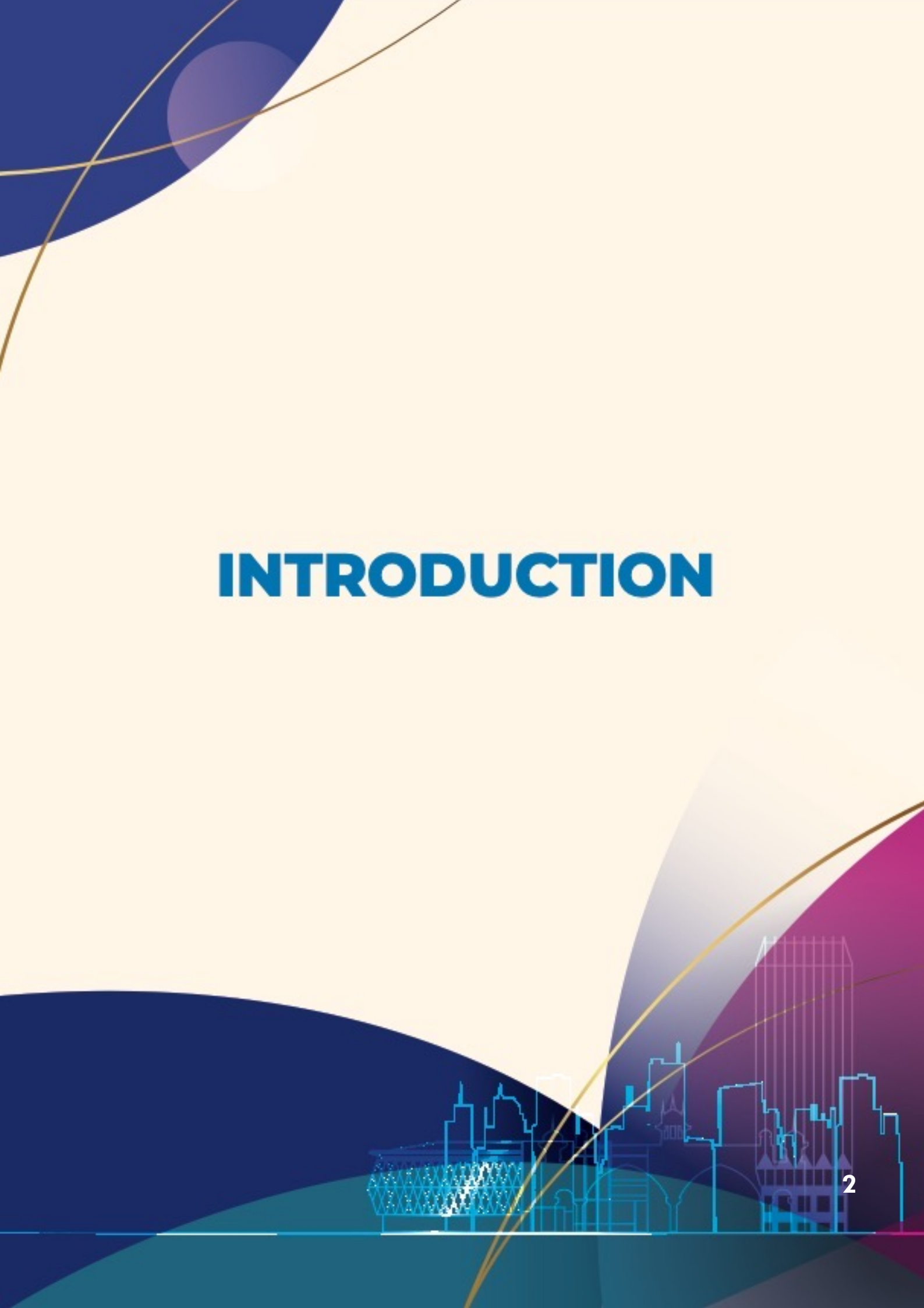

- **Incorporated Universal Design:** The project must incorporate universal design principles in its physical features, ensuring accessibility and inclusivity for people of all ages and abilities.
- **Space Usage & Layout:** Assessment of the design's concept, layout efficiency, and flow, focusing on accessibility, connectivity, and child-friendly elements.
- **Safety & Comfort:** Degree to which the design prioritizes safety, comfort, and a welcoming atmosphere for children and families.

3. Uses & Activities

- **Placemaking Approach:** Evaluation of the "hardware" (physical design), "software" (programming, activities), and "orgware" (management structure) approach.
- **Before & After Impact:** Demonstration of transformation, with before and after visuals or descriptions to show improved child-friendliness.

Child Friendly | Neighbourhood

Child Friendly Neighbourhood category celebrates existing and implemented neighbourhoods—including both landed residential areas and high-rise communities such as condominiums, apartments, or flats—that have taken concrete steps to create child friendly environments. This category focuses solely on neighbourhoods that have already incorporated these elements, showcasing real-life examples of safe, inclusive, and enriching environments that support children’s needs and encourage a sense of community.

SAFETY & SECURITY

- **Traffic Safety:** Implementing traffic-calming measures, safe pedestrian crossings, and clear signage to reduce vehicle speeds and protect children.
- **Safe Play Areas:** Providing secure play spaces away from traffic, with equipment that meets safety standards and is appropriate for different age groups.
- **Well-Lit Spaces:** Ensuring well-lit streets, pathways, and common areas to enhance visibility and security, making children and families feel safe at all times.

ACCESSIBILITY & INCLUSIVITY

- **Physical Accessibility:** Designing pathways, entrances, and play areas that are accessible to children of all abilities, including those with disabilities.
- **Barrier-Free Design:** Assessment of features like ramps, wide paths, elevators, and other universal design elements that ensure ease of movement for children, parents with strollers, wheelchair users, and the elderly.

Child Friendly | Commercial

Child Friendly Commercial category recognizes commercial spaces that actively support a safe, engaging, and welcoming environment for children and families. This category encourages businesses to incorporate child-friendly elements that enhance the experience for families, promoting inclusivity, accessibility, and enjoyment in commercial settings.

Eligible Commercial Types :

This category is open to a variety of commercial spaces, such as:

Shopping Malls : Large retail environments that include child-safe play areas, family-friendly facilities, and dedicated spaces for children's activities.

Food & Beverage Establishments : Restaurants, cafes, and food courts that offer amenities like high chairs, children's menus, family seating areas, and playful decor to make dining comfortable and enjoyable for families.

Retail Stores : Individual retail shops or chain stores that prioritize child-friendly layouts, accessible facilities, and engaging features, like interactive displays or family rest areas.

Entertainment Venues : Cinemas, arcades, play centers, or museums that design spaces and activities with children's interests and safety in mind.

Healthcare & Wellness Centers : Clinics, pediatric facilities, or wellness centers that consider the comfort and needs of children and families, such as child-friendly waiting areas and accessible services.

Other Public-Facing Commercial Spaces : Any other commercial spaces that interact with the public, like banks, salons, or bookstores, that prioritize a welcoming, accessible experience for families with children.

Child Friendly Commercial category recognizes commercial spaces that actively support a safe, engaging, and welcoming environment for children and families. This category encourages businesses to incorporate child-friendly elements that enhance the experience for families, promoting inclusivity, accessibility, and enjoyment in commercial settings.

- **Support for Family Activities:** Are there any activities or programs tailored for children or families, such as weekend events or workshops?

- **Community Engagement:** Has the project engaged or supported the local community in any way, such as partnering with nearby schools, hosting family events, or collaborating with community groups?
- **Focus on Family Needs:** Does the space demonstrate an understanding of the needs of local families, offering services or facilities that make it easier for families to visit?

Child Friendly | Public Park



Child Friendly Public Park category will focus on how well parks provide a safe, inclusive, and stimulating environment for children while being accessible to all community members. This includes aspects like safety, play features, natural elements, inclusivity, and sustainability.

This category recognizes private parks developed by property developers that are **open to the public and designed with a strong commitment to creating safe, accessible, and engaging environments for children and families**. These parks may be part of residential or commercial developments, yet they serve a broader community function, welcoming families and individuals from surrounding areas.

Eligible Parks in this Category :

Private Parks in Residential Developments : Parks within residential communities that prioritize child-friendly, inclusive play and gathering spaces, while being accessible to the general public.

Green Spaces within Mixed-Use Developments : Parks located within commercial or mixed-use developments that provide safe, well-maintained, and welcoming environments for children and families.

Developer - Owned but Publicly Accessible Parks : Any privately developed park space that invites the public to enjoy its facilities, promoting recreation, community connection, and children's well-being.

This category celebrates developers who contribute to the community by creating child-friendly spaces that prioritize accessibility, sustainability, and inclusive design, supporting children's play, social interaction, and connection with nature.

SAFETY & ACCESSIBILITY

- **Child Safety Features:** Evaluation of safety measures like cushioned play surfaces, clear boundaries, appropriate fencing, and child-safe equipment.
- **Universal Accessibility:** Presence of accessible paths, ramps, and seating areas that enable children and people with limited mobility to enjoy the park fully.
- **Visible Signage & Lighting:** Adequate lighting for visibility and clear signage indicating different areas, facilities, and rules to ensure a safe and easy-to-navigate environment.

PLAY & LEARNING SPACES

- **Diverse Play Areas:** Availability of various play zones that support physical, sensory, and social activities for children of different ages and abilities.
- **Educational Features:** Integration of educational elements like nature trails, interactive exhibits, or signage that teaches children about the environment, wildlife, or sustainability.
- **Flexible Use of Space:** Open, adaptable spaces that can be used for free play, picnics, family gatherings, or community events.

Child Friendly | Institution

Child Friendly Institution category recognizes institutions that go above and beyond to create supportive, safe, and enriching environments for children. Whether you are a school, kindergarten, college, university, healthcare provider, or community organization, this award celebrates your commitment to child-friendly spaces and services. MBPJ welcome submissions from all institutions that prioritize the needs, safety, and well-being of children in their facilities, programs, and policies. Your work in fostering inclusive, accessible, and nurturing environments contributes to making Petaling Jaya a model for a child-friendly city. Join us in showcasing your efforts and inspiring others to follow your lead!

SAFETY & ACCESSIBILITY

- **Child-Safe Environment:** Measures in place to ensure safety for children, such as secure entry points, well-marked emergency exits, child-safe furniture, and hazard-free areas.
- **Accessible Design:** Inclusive facilities that are accessible to children of all abilities, including ramps, elevators, wide corridors, and accessible restrooms.
- **Emergency Preparedness:** Evidence of child-centered emergency procedures and signage, ensuring staff and children know what to do in case of emergencies.

CHILD-CENTERED FACILITIES & RESOURCES

- **Resource Accessibility:** Access to age-appropriate educational and recreational materials, such as books, games, sports equipment, or art supplies.

INCLUSIVE & SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

- **Support Services:** Presence of child-friendly services, like guidance counsellors, medical care, mental health support, or disability services, to support the well-being of children.
- **Cultural Sensitivity:** Inclusive policies and practices that respect diverse cultural backgrounds, ensuring children feel accepted and valued.
- **Policies Against Discrimination and Bullying:** Anti-bullying policies, diversity training for staff, and mechanisms to prevent and address discrimination or exclusion.

ENGAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

- **Educational Programs:** Availability of programs that engage children in meaningful, age-appropriate learning and development activities.
- **Extracurricular Activities:** Access to extracurricular programs that allow children to explore interests in arts, sports, science, or technology.
- **Community Engagement:** Efforts to connect with the local community, offering events, workshops, or family programs that strengthen community ties.

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HEALTH, WELLNESS & COMFORT

- **Healthy Environment:** Maintenance of clean and hygienic facilities, with child-appropriate sanitation facilities and regular cleaning practices.
- **Mental Health Support:** Availability of resources or support for children's mental and emotional well-being, such as access to counselling, relaxation spaces, or wellness programs.
- **Comfortable Atmosphere:** Design of spaces with child-friendly colours, materials, and furnishings that create a comfortable and welcoming environment.

ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY & SUSTAINABILITY

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Child Friendly | Community

Child Friendly Community category recognizes community-based organizations, residents' associations, clubs, non-governmental organizations, social enterprises, and similar entities that prioritize creating inclusive and supportive environments for children. The award honours communities that actively engage children in meaningful ways, allowing them to participate in decision-making, set house rules, and shape their community spaces. By fostering child participation, inclusivity, and a sense of belonging, these communities contribute to a safer, more nurturing environment where children feel empowered and valued.

Eligibility of Participants :

Community-Based Organizations : Groups that operate within a local community, such as resident associations, clubs, and social enterprises.

Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) : NGOs that focus on child welfare, community development, or social support services.

Clubs and Associations : Youth clubs, family clubs, or other associations that provide recreational, educational, or social activities for children.

Social Enterprises : Community-driven businesses that have a specific focus on child-friendly programs or community improvement.

Eligible participants must demonstrate existing and implemented child-friendly practices in their operations, with a focus on promoting inclusivity, safety, and active child engagement in their neighbourhood or community.

CHILD INCLUSIVITY & PARTICIPATION

- **Inclusive Environment:** Demonstrates a welcoming and accessible environment where all children—regardless of age, ability, or background—are encouraged to participate.

- **Protective Measures:** Training and awareness on child protection within the organization to ensure that children's rights and safety are prioritized.

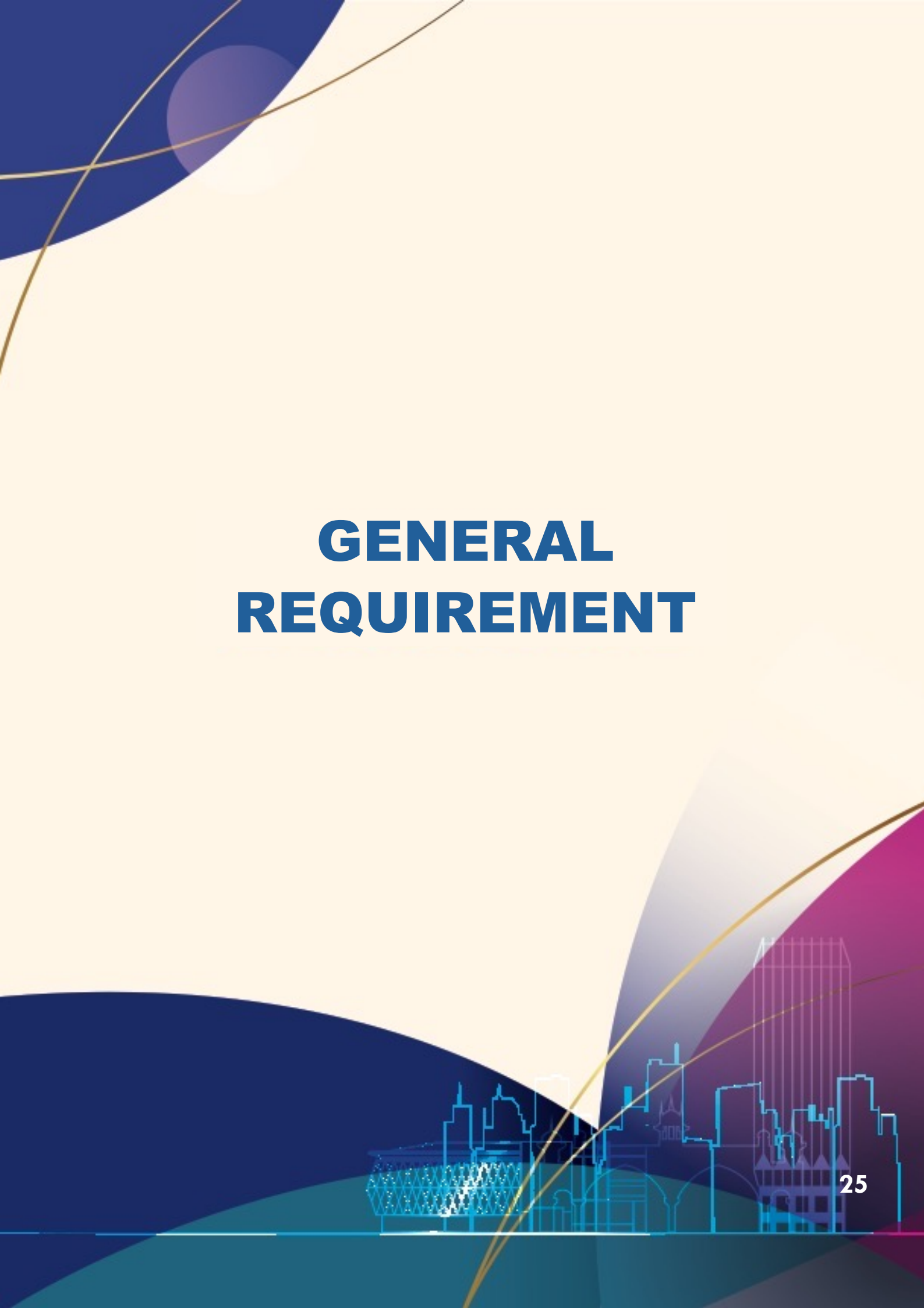

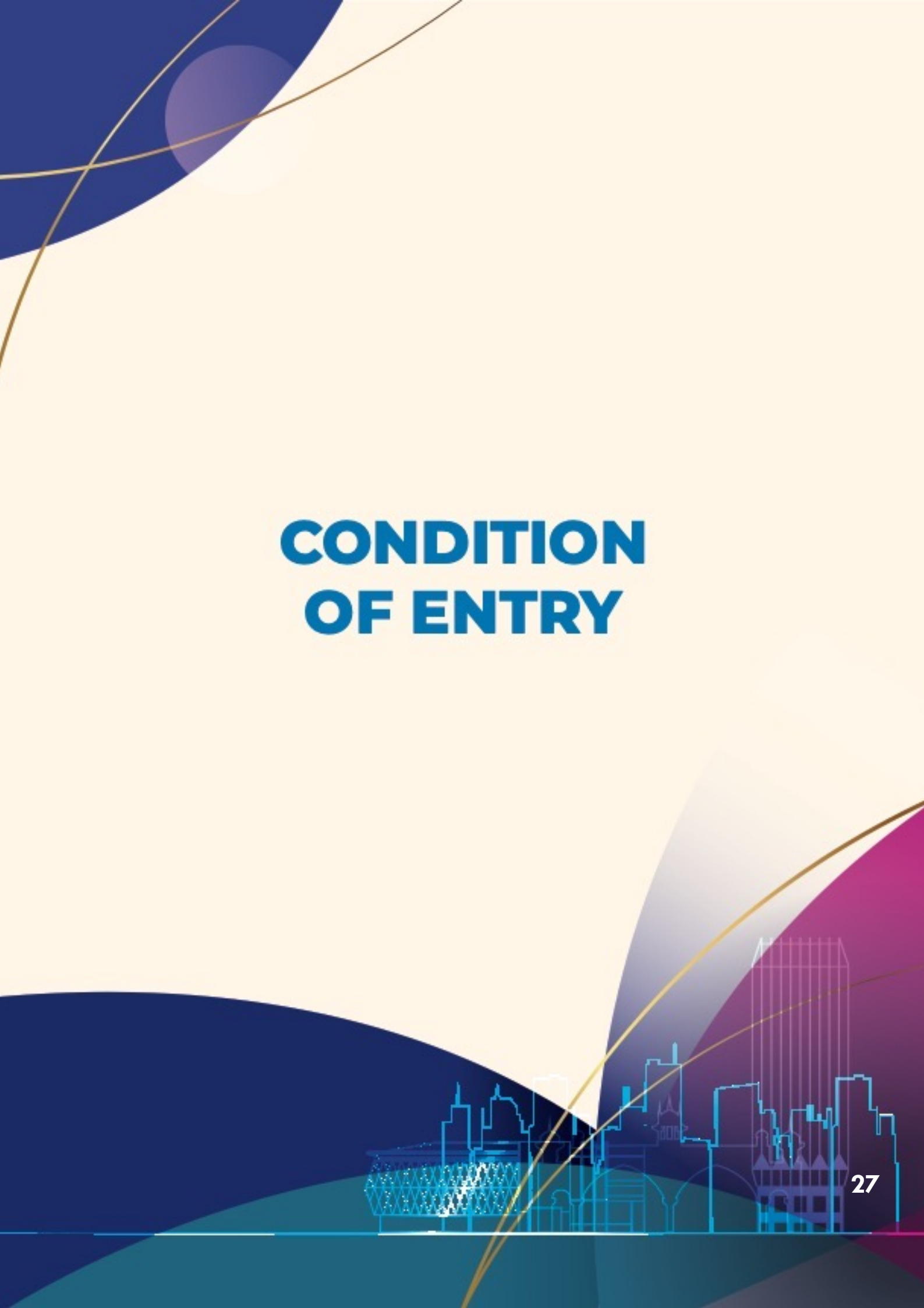

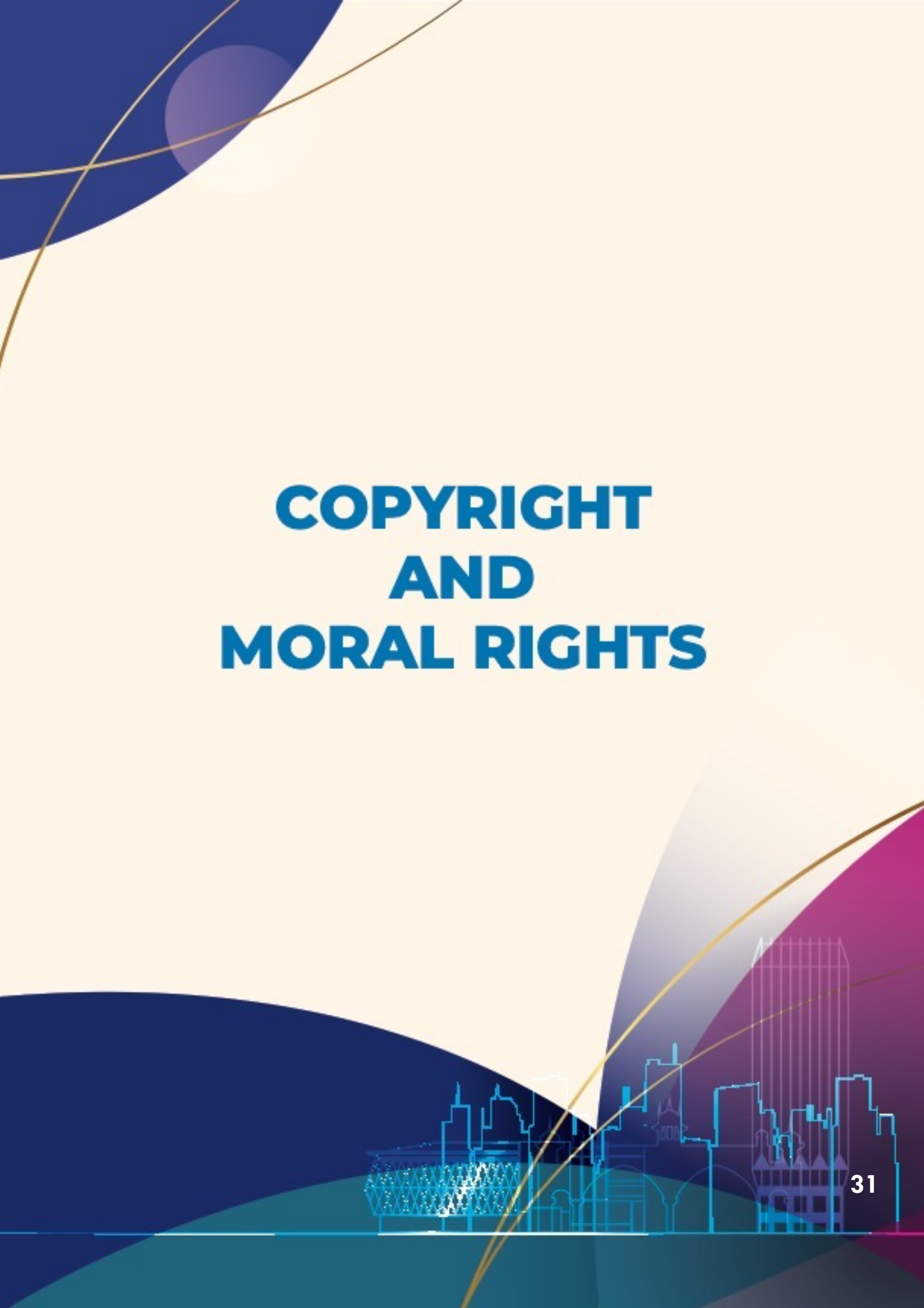
